
# Save the Dates!




# Exhibit: READ

# On view until March 6 JML Reading Room

In October, JML launched a new exhibit about the history of censorship in Central Virginia. The exhibit examines the historical frameworks for restrictive efforts that occurred from the 1660s to the 1960s. Covering issues related to religion, abolition, and communism, "READ" shares censorship examples from across the Commonwealth, including from JML's own history.

"READ" is supported by a Judith F. Krug Memorial Fund Banned Books Week Programming Grant from The Freedom to Read Foundation. In 2025 five awardees from across the nation were selected among a competitive pool of libraries, schools and nonprofit organizations to offer innovative and engaging programming. The exhibit is on display until March 6, 2026.

"READ" is free and open to the public in the JML Reading Room. Groups may contact the library to arrange a tour.




#### JML On the Road

## **New Equipment Arrives**

JML recently took delivery of our new wide format scanner (*pictured:* Collections Assistant Garrett R. tackles assembly of the support frame).

Our new Context Ultra HD scanner will be used to digitize large items like architectural plans, posters, and maps.

The scanner and other equipment for our Memory & Digitization Lab is possible due to a generous grant from the George W. Reynolds Memorial Fund and the Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation.

Patrons will be able to request wide format scanning, and conversion of other materials into digital formats, at the library starting in 2026.


#### **Enslaved.org Datasets**

In 2023, JML launched a multi-year project to document the names of enslaved persons mentioned in the Library's manuscript collections. That same year, the Library published our first dataset from Manuscript 1047 *The Seth Woodroof Account Book*.

The data from this project has now been incorporated into the search function on Enslaved.org, allowing researchers to find these names when searching for Lynchburg records.

In October, JML published a second dataset about Manuscript 1141 *The Potter Estate Papers*. The dataset and an article are now accessible via the *Journal of Slavery & Data Preservation*. The MS1141 data is expected to be searchable on Enslaved.org in the coming year.
